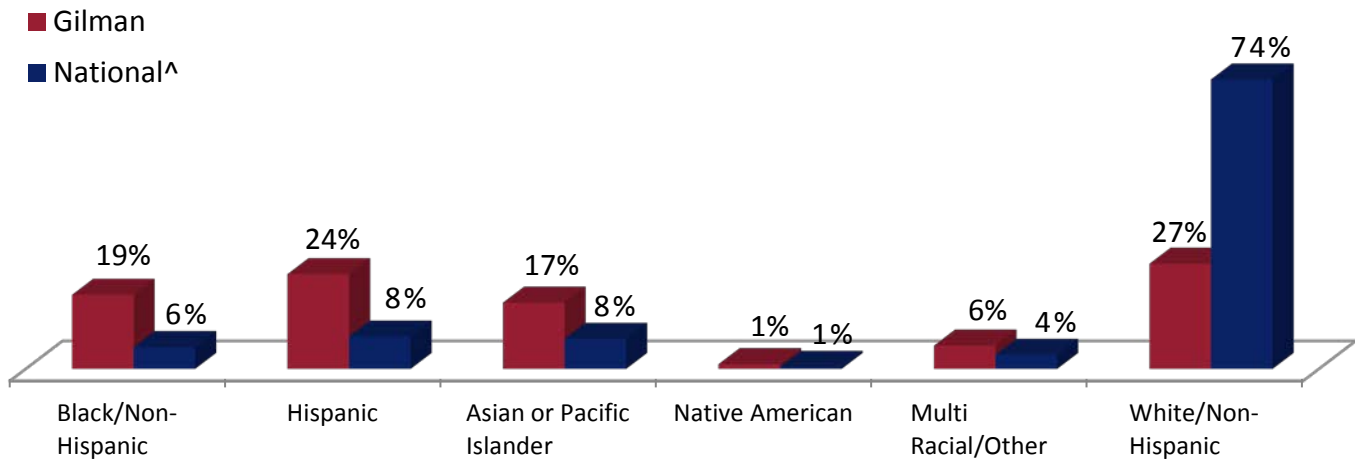


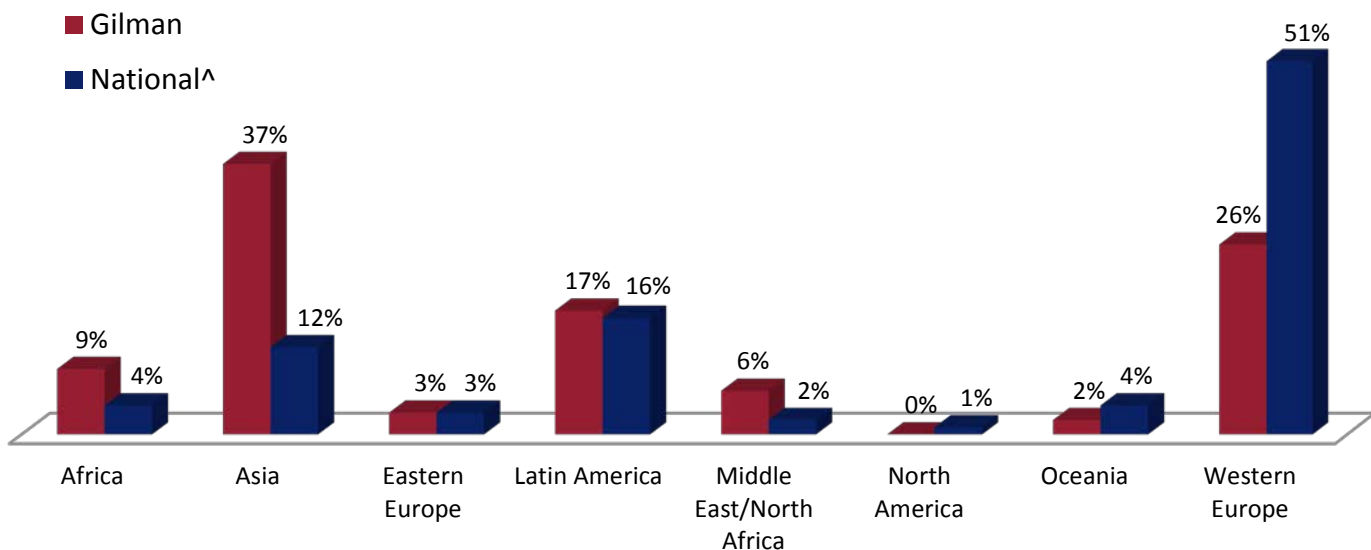
Gilman Scholars Comparison to National Study Abroad Academic Year 2015-2016

Ethnicity



Gilman scholars are more diverse than the national study abroad population with three times more Black/Non-Hispanic students, three times as many Hispanic students, and twice as many Asian/Pacific Islander students.

Region of Study



Gilman scholars participate in programs in more diverse locations than the national study abroad population with three times more students to both MENA and Asia.

At 72%, majority of Gilman scholars choose to study and intern in non-traditional destinations.
