Applicants should have successfully completed a US government-supported Chinese language study program that includes a minimum of 8 weeks of study in China prior to the time of enrollment.

Amount: \$10,000 for one year of study; awardees who maintain a GPA of 3.4 or higher will be considered for renewal of the fellowship
