Celebrating National Hispanic Heritage Month

The U.S. Department of State's Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program is reshaping study abroad to make it more accessible and inclusive for high-achieving American students who represent the rich diversity of the United States to study or intern around the world. The Gilman Program is proud to have significant engagement from students attending Hispanic-Serving Institutions (HSIs) to study or intern abroad as Gilman Scholars.

Since the program's creation in 2001, 1,335 U.S. institutions have sent more than 31,000 Gilman Scholars to 151 countries. Recipients are awarded up to \$5,000 (or up to \$8,000 for the Gilman Critical Need Language Award) to be used toward the cost of study abroad or internships abroad.
