Gilman Scholarship Photo Contest

Rules and Regulations

Thank you for your interest in participating in the Gilman Scholarship's International Education Week Photo Contest. Please read below for the rules and regulations on participating:

- Photos will be judged by how well they capture the spirit of international scholarship as seen through the unique experience of a Gilman Scholar. They should be dynamic, tell a powerful story, or showcase a unique interaction between a scholar and their community.
- There are six categories, they are as follows:
 - o People – photographs that capture the human element of either Gilman Scholars or subjects that they have encountered during their international scholarship (either virtual or in person),
 - o Unique Places & Spaces – photographs that capture a setting or environment that is singular and or holds a deep meaning for the photographer.
 - o Nature/Landscape – photographs that specifically capture either a specific natural phenomenon, facet of the natural world, or entire natural landscape.
 - o My Virtual World – photographs that capture either the experience of a virtual study abroad program, or a virtual aspect of an in-person study abroad program.
 - o Diversity in My Community – photographs that capture either diversity within the photographer's study abroad/international community or diversity within the photographer's home community as it has been affected by their international scholarship.
 - o Gilman's Giving Back – photographs that capture the humanitarian spirit of the Gilman Scholarship either during study abroad or how the photographer's public service has been affected by their international experience after returning home.
- There is a limit of two photos per entrant. Entrants must be Gilman Scholarship Recipients or Alumni.
- Photos must be submitted in JPEG, JPG, or PNG format in the highest resolution possible to gilmanphotos@iie.org. Note that photos may be disqualified if they are too low in quality.
- Photos that have been digitally altered beyond standard optimization (removal of dust, cropping, reasonable adjustments to exposure, color, and contrast, etc.) will be disqualified.
- Name photos with the following convention: `Category_Name_TermAbroad`
- For each submission, a caption of the photo and where you studied abroad must be included. Entries without both will not be considered for the contest.
- By submitting photos to the contest, you are giving your consent for The Gilman Program to use your photos for promotional purposes. If you do not give consent, say so explicitly in your submission email and add a note to file name (ie: `Consent not given_Category_Name_TermAbroad`).
