Anyssa's academic experience as a Gilman Scholar in Hiroshima, Japan, was inspired by her interest in nuclear power policy, and recovery and resilience after nuclear crises. Alongside various peers with dynamic talents and interests, Anyssa visited the World Friendship Center and attended lectures on nuclear policy. During this visit, she listened to the testimony of an atomic bomb survivor, an experience that profoundly impacted her life and routed her career trajectory toward international conflict mitigation and politics.

After returning from this experience, Anyssa transferred to Swarthmore College as a McCabe Scholar. She is pursuing a degree in linguistics, and peace and conflict studies. Anyssa's Gilman experience has inspired her to continue pursuing international learning opportunities. She has since participated in the Critical Language Scholarship Program, traveling to Azerbaijan. Anyssa hopes to become a Foreign Service Officer.

Ayyad interned as a Gilman Scholar at the United States embassy in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, where he worked closely with career diplomats in the political, consular and management sections. He witnessed and experienced diplomacy in action, negotiations and conferences with international diplomats.

The exposure Ayyad had at the American embassy in Saudi Arabia, in addition to major shifts in the political climate in the United States, inspired him to make a difference at a more local level. Therefore, upon returning to the United States, Ayyad focused his Follow-on Service Project on introducing diplomacy to high schoolers, sharing how it shapes our international political spectrum and affects our daily lives.

Ayyadjoined the Yemeni American Merchants Association (YAMA) as the Director of Advocacy where he served as the organization's principal advocate on city, state and federal government affairs. He advocated policy priorities and strategies serving the Yemeni-American community.

Currently, Ayyad is working with the New York City Mayor's Office of Immigrant Affairs as a Neighborhood Organizer. He connects immigrant New Yorkers to city resources and services, and amplifies their concerns and needs to the mayor's office.

This ignited a passion for teaching ESL and would prove transformative when she graduated.

For three years following graduation, Jeydelyn served as a Language and Culture Assistant through the Spanish Ministry of Culture, Education and Vocational Training grant program. Working in primary and secondary schools in Aranjuez, Malaga and Valladolid, she developed further as an educator and bilingual professional. Wanting to expand her language skill set and once again step outside of her comfort zone, she took a position as kindergarten teacher in Shenzhen, China.

Robert completed his required Follow-on Service Project by presenting twice on the Gilman Scholarship to young people incarcerated in the Forrest County Juvenile Detention Center in Hattiesburg, Mississippi. He now has embarked on a journey to become a screenwriter, studying under Larry Wilson (known for his work on Beetlejuice and The Addams Family).
