How to Make It Happen

The U.S. Department of State is committed to ensuring that our future leaders gain the critical skills they need for today's and tomorrow's world. We provide scholarships for more than 7,000 U.S. students to go abroad each year through our exchange programs! These are just a few:

Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program: This program provides study and intern abroad opportunities for Pell Grant recipients. Under the Gilman Program, the John McCain International Scholarship for Children of Military Families supports U.S. undergraduate students who are children of active-duty military personnel and Title IV recipients.

Critical Language Scholarship (CLS) Program: This program places U.S. undergraduate and graduate students in fully-funded intensive summer language institutes overseas in 14 critical foreign languages. The CLS Spark initiative offers virtual language learning in Arabic, Chinese, and Russian.

Fulbright U.S. Student Program: This program sends recent college graduates, graduate students, and early career professionals to study and conduct research or teach English in countries across the globe.
