Metzin studied abroad as a Gilman scholar during the summer of 2021 through the Council on International Educational Exchange (CIEE) Study Abroad program at Yonsei University in Seoul, South Korea. Her time in South Korea taught her to not be afraid to ask questions because it helped her connect with others, learn new things, and change her experiences abroad and back at home. The answers to her questions—whether from her university advisors, fellow students, or locals—always made her feel more confident, and she would then help other students. She became friends with Korean students, learned more about their experiences and favorite foods, and was introduced to their culture. She also learned to be spontaneous and get out of her comfort zone as she was trying to speak a new language and remain resilient while many changes occurred due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Looking back, Metzin is happy to have met remarkable and kind people with whom she made unforgettable friendships.

Metzin credits her Gilman Program experience with her personal and professional growth. Some of the skills she acquired while abroad include the ability to collaborate and network with peers that have similar goals but are from diverse backgrounds; learn about a new culture through lectures, books, and hands-on experiences; and understand sustainability through an international lens. Metzin also completed a social media internship with CIEE during her time abroad, blogging and writing stories about the program and her experiences for future CIEE applicants.
